

## Cohen and Wolf Attorney to Be Acknowledged With Others for Role in Developing New Connecticut Probate Court Rules of Procedure

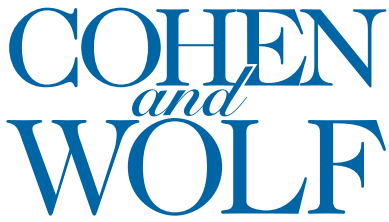

Between June, 2011 and September, 2012, the committee completed a comprehensive revision to the Connecticut Probate Practice Book (now known as the Probate Court Rules of Procedure). The probate court administrator submitted the proposed revision to the Connecticut Supreme Court for approval in October 2012. The Connecticut Supreme Court approved the rules on November 7, 2012, with an effective date of July 1, 2013. This project builds upon the improvements from the recent structural changes to the Probate Court system, further strengthening professionalism and fostering uniformity in the probate courts in Connecticut.

Solomon is a principal and chair of Cohen and Wolf's Trusts & Estates, Elder Law, and Tax Groups. She has been assisting clients in the areas of estate planning, elder law and probate administration (including estates, trusts, conservatorships, guardianships, etc.) for more than 30 years.
